

Conditions of admission

The Salvation Army Adult Rehabilitation center offers a comprehensive program of recovery which addresses many issues including criminal behavior, addiction and social skills. It teaches men how to change their lives in the hopes of making them productive citizens of our communities, fathers and husbands in their homes, and valued employees in the work place.

A Rule 25 is NOT needed for entrance into our program

The following conditions must be met:

- Be male, 21 years of age or older
- Have a valid ID (driver's license, certified copy of birth certificate, or passport)
- Out of state residents must spend 1 night at another Minnesota address and bring written proof of such to enter our program (hotel receipts are acceptable. Our sister facility, The Salvation Army Harbor Light at 1010 Currie Ave. also qualifies.)
- Have no court dates or outside appointments scheduled for 30 days after admission to our facility
- Provide names and phone numbers for all parole officers, judges and attorneys as applicable (we cannot notify anyone whose name is not provided.)
- Disclose any previous professional diagnosis of bi-polar disorder or schizophrenia
- Have a 30-day supply of all medication needed (must be pre-approved by staff)
- Be physically able to participate in 40 hours per week of work therapy
- Disclose any court-imposed building or visitor restrictions
- Disclose any previous criminal convictions for arson or sexual offense
- Bring no weapons of any kind into the facility
- If receiving SSI or other cash government assistance, be willing and able to pre-pay 75% of monthly benefit or \$150 per week, whichever is less. This must be paid prior to intake.
- Limit the number of personal items brought into the center. Any personal items brought will be inventoried and most will be placed in storage and will not be accessible. We will not be responsible for loss or damage to any item stored.
